Dear Friends,

Our Vicechair, Madeleine Wang and I met with the Warden recently to discuss how the Friends would fit in with the new Launde Companions.

We then subsequently reported to the Friends Committee who supported our suggestions. It was agreed that the Friends in their present form would continue: raising funds through subscriptions and donations, and occasional fund raising events.

We also agreed that in future the Friends would not actively recruit new members but if approached we would not stop people joining.

Friends will therefore now have three choices going forward:

- a) To continue as they are, paying their subscriptions and donations to Friends of Launde.
- b) To change to being a Companion.
- c) To join both staying in the Friends but also joining the Companions.

We understand that joining the Companions would enable people to have certain benefits like being given priority booking of some Retreats.

I do believe that Launde needs to build large and broad up a membership of people who will support the work of Launde in various ways thereby securing its future. This is what the Companions is about. I hope we can all support the splendid ideas behind Companions, the whether or not we decide to ioin them.

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Introducing one of our Trustees

Hello,

I'm Ann Green and I have been a Trustee of The Friends of Launde Abbev for more than five years now. professional background is primarily as an HR Director in the NHS - although I have also worked as an independent Consultant in various Healthcare organisations and charities. Nowadays, Chair of Light Project am Peterborough - a Christian charity supporting rough sleepers. I am a committed Christian and worship at St Werrington John's Church. in Peterborough.

I first became aware of Launde Abbey more than 10 years ago when a charity with which I was involved held a Quiet Day at Little Gidding. The leader for the day was Sister Rachel Overton. Over lunch Sister Rachel mentioned that she and Rev Alison Christian - the then Warden at Launde Abbev - were setting up a two year course to train Spiritual Directors. was really interested in the course and applied for a place. After a 'challenging' interview I WAS offered a place and embarked on the training in September 2013.

Before my interview, I had never been to Launde. It was a sunny day and as I drove over the cattle grid at the top of the hill I remember audibly gasping at the beauty of the scene in front of me. My feeling was, even if I was not offered a place on the course, I had to come back. And I certainly did – for approximately one day every month for two years. No "Zooming" or "Working from Home" in those days!

The course was challenging, exhilarating and exhausting, in equal measures, and after two years 16 of us – from both the Peterborough and Leicester Dioceses – qualified as Spiritual Directors.

Since that time, I have continued to work as Spiritual Director with many people from very different backgrounds and experiences. I would argue the title "Spiritual Director" is anomalous as there is no "directing" involved. It is simply about walking alongside someone on their spiritual journey. It is such a joy and a privilege to be called to do His work in this way.
