Our stays predated the refurbishment of Launde and I can remember ice on the inside of windows, meals in the Oak Room and a cellar full of "Wardens' Wares". Walks beyond Launde were always in our programme and I recall that there was a pub on the Oakham Road towards Tilton to which we escaped on Saturday evenings.

My job as a teacher of French in Loughborough was demanding and fulfilling. I have always loved the way knowing other languages provides a gateway into other ways of living and thinking because the words we use belong to a culture and a history. That includes worship and I have attended services with Lutheran friends Germany and Roman Catholic friends in France. There is more than one way of doing things and our faith and our seeking should, in my view, lead us to open new doors and discover new vistas.

After joining the Friends of Launde I got involved on retirement in working with a team who stuffed envelopes periodically with the latest edition of Launde Leaves and communications to Friends. That led to being part of the team that produced Launde Leaves for a number of years. In 2016 I started working as a volunteer at Launde and you may have met me on Reception when checking in for a retreat or visiting the shop. There are also the days when the internet goes down, or there are no taxis available to take a guest to Oakham Station, or a guest who must have a shower is booked into a room with a bath. Experiencing the "other side of the front desk" and learning all the practical as well as spiritual things that make Launde tick has been an eye-opener.
